Kinds of Protection

Patents of Invention	Granted for a term of 20 years from submission date; short-term patents granted for 10 years
Extensions	The terms of patents for medicinal products, and many agricultural chemicals, require market authorisation before they can be sold commercially, can be extended for up to five years by supplementary protection certificates.

Filing for Patents

Patents are granted for an invention which is new, involves an inventive step and has an industrial application. Applications may be made, in any language, by any person either jointly with another or alone. If the application is not in Irish or English, the Office will require a translation into one of those languages. The right to a patent belongs to the inventor(s) or their successors in title.

Examination is carried out upon the request of the applicant. Patent applications must have a filing date, at least one claim and must not be deemed to be withdrawn for examination to be undertaken. Alternatively, the applicant may submit a statement to the Controller that an application for a patent for the same invention has been made in the United Kingdom, in Germany, by the PCT, by the EPO or by an authority on whose behalf the EPO conducts searches.

Patent applications are published after a period of 18 months beginning on the date of filing, or if priority is claimed, from the date of priority. The applicant can request the publication to be earlier. Any person may file observations apply to the patent office for the revocation of a patent.

PCT applications can only designate Ireland via the European Patent Office.
