The EBook Central Application is a native MacOS Application built using the Flutter UI Framework. The default ePub reader has a known issue due to integration with Flutter that is outside of our control and significantly impacts the accessibility of the reading experience. As a result, content in the default ePub reader view is not

programmatically accessible or navigable. A text-only mode is available and must be manually enabled through a user's profile settings. The ePub-viewer integration issue occurs on Windows and MacOS, so users are encouraged to use Android, iOS, and the web experience as a workaround. The integration issue with Flutter is being worked on.

The native application is designed to respect and respond to user customizations and operating system-level accessibility settings. This includes support for high contrast themes, increased text size, magnification, language, and other features when configured through the device or operating system settings.

A known issue exists throughout the application when a user presses Tab while VoiceOver is running moves keyboard focus, but VoiceOver does not announce the newly focused element. Only items that receive direct screen-reader focus are spoken. Work-around: Use Object Navigation mode (VO + Arrow keys) as your main way to interact with the macOS app when VoiceOver is active, especially for focusable controls such as buttons, text fields, menu items, and list items.
