The system is optimized for efficiency, bringing users directly to the checkout screen upon interaction. Items can be added either by placing them on an RFID pad for automatic scanning or by manually scanning barcodes using a handheld scanner. Library staff can easily customize the experience using Polaris Administration settings, tailoring the interface and functionality to meet specific needs.
