## **Evaluation Methods Used:**

A combination of automated and manual testing techniques was employed for the accessibility assessment.

- Manual assessment was performed using Chrome Version 127.0.6533.89 on Windows 11 and included exclusive use of the keyboard.
- Automated tools used included axe Auditor and the axe Dev Tools browser extension.
- Assistive technologies employed included NVDA Version 2024.1.
