VHA Online does use color to indicate the current main navigation selection. When the page is viewed in gray scale, the color (red) used to indicate the current nav selection exhibits lower contrast than its cohorts, visually isolating it from the other nav selections though contrast should be improved. Compliance determined using Color Contrast Analyzer, and Photoshop gray-scale mode.

However, there so seem to be some major exceptions and problem areas, like the Index Search page. The 'Places Search' page seems to lack some keyboard support. For example, fully scrolling and exploring and selecting contents of the Locations and Types lists using the keyboard alone does not seem possible. The Index Search with its nested 'Term Choices' list is bewildering to attempt to use with a keyboard alone. Compliance determined with observation, manual keyboard testing, and NVDA.

The visually hard-to-perceive focus can make matters worse. The user can easily experience an effective keyboard trap. Many nested lists on search pages can be very long such as the 'Indexing Terms Choices' list on Index Search. Once the user has tabbed into the middle of a list, it can be very difficult to get out using the keyboard. 'Places Search' provides another example of a page where it might not be immediately clear to a keyboard user how they would access the 'Locations' selections at the left-side of the page. Although tabbing can get you to the Locations/Types radio buttons and arrow keys or space bar let you choose, it is not obvious how you navigate to corresponding options for either using the keyboard. However, there are several recognized problems Heading tags are not used correctly to structure page content. Title placement is inconsistent with vertical placement. For example, Search vs. Index Search pages. As the user tabs through the interactive elements on the page, the visual focus appears to disappear when encountering a collapsed list of checkbox controls. For example, in the 'Collections' list on the Search page. If the 'Canadian Collections' list is collapsed, continuing to tab when you reach that item, causes the focus to go into that collapsed list of items. The focus should only go into that list if the user has pressed Enter to expand that list first. Compliance determined with observation, manual keyboard testing, and NVDA. On the Quick Search page, access to three combo-box drop-downs (hidden behind a 'down' chevron by default), is problematic/non-intuitive by default. The drop-downs are Language, Gender, and Experience Group.

The change in context happens automatically upon selection even though on-screen text instructs the user to make a selection and then click Next even though the latter instruction seems unnecessary. 
